### This month's program



Elvina Truman Pearce will present a program on "Self-Directed Practice: A Key to Student Success and Motivation" at our September 7th meeting. The session will be based on the premise that in order for students to find practice rewarding and productive, they must learn how to self-direct it. The presentation will focus on what must happen at the lesson in order to facilitate this outcome.

Elvina Pearce studied in New York City with Russian artist-teacher Isabelle Vangerova. She was a pedagogy student of Frances Clark in Princeton, NJ, taught piano and pedagogy at Westminster Choir College, and helped found the New School for Music Study. She taught pedagogy and directed the Preparatory Piano Division at Northwestern University for 14 years. She now resides in Naperville, where she is a teacher and founder and director of the Division of Preparatory and Community Music at North Central College.

Ms. Pearce's concert career included a solo appearance with the Chicago Symphony in Orchestra Hall, a broadcast over *The Chicago Theater of the Air*, and recitals in Carnegie Recital Hall in New York, and the National Gallery of Art in Washington, D.C.

Elvina Pearce has presented workshops, recitals, and master classes in more than 40 states as well as in Canada, China, and Australia, where she was a keynote speaker and recitalist at the 1999 Australian National Piano Pedagogy Conference at Western Australia University in Perth. In 2000, she presented workshops sponsored by the Western Australia MTA and the Suzuki Talent Education Association. She has been a frequent headliner at MTNA national conferences as well as at MTA state and division meetings throughout the U.S.

In addition to her ongoing career as a pianist, lecturer, adjudicator, and nationally acclaimed composer of educational piano music, Elvina Pearce is one of the founders of the *Frances Clark Center for Keyboard Pedagogy*, and serves as Vice President on its Board of Trustees. In 2000, she was appointed Editor-in-Chief of *KEYBOARD COMPANION Magazine* with which she has been associated since its inaugural issue in 1990.

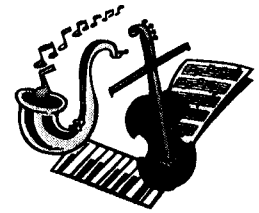
## **AIM Theory Examinations Information**

AIM Theory Examinations will be held on Saturday, November 11, 2006 at Wheaton College. The enrollment deadline is October 14. Levels three and above must participate in these exams in order to be eligible for the Performance Exams which will be held in March. As you prepare your students, be sure you are using the latest AIM Syllabus (July 2003)

In order to enter students, all teachers must fulfill the following requirements:

1. Attend two complete business meetings and programs before the performance exams.
2. Serve as judge or work in the office a specific number of hours (based on the number of students entered)
3. Attend the mandatory judging sessions for both theory and performance examinations. The theory session will be incorporated in the November meeting.
